Entry into school

Please can we ask that parents do not come into school to ensure school security and safeguarding, if you need to contact the school please call on **01362 692665** or email the office - office@scarning.norfolk.sch.uk. If you need to drop something off for your child please name it and leave in the green box outside the office or in the school post box. You do not need to ring the intercom. If you need to collect your child early please ring the office intercom and wait outside for your child to come out to you. If your child arrives late for school they need to come into the office lobby themselves and we will buzz them through the inner door.

If you need to speak to a class teacher please email them directly or message via class dojo.

Weekly Newsletter

We send our weekly newsletter by email every Friday. You will receive a colour newsletter this way and it reduces paper usage. We are happy to send a newsletter to more than one address per pupil - for example if parents/carers are separated.

When contacting the school office please make sure to include your child's full name and class.

Please ensure you arrive at school just before your child's class is due to come in. Yr6 should not be on site before 8.20am.

School barriers

The barriers giving car access into school will be down during morning and afternoon drop off times. There will be no access at all through these from 8.35—9am. These will also be down at lunch time. This is to reduce the amount of traffic in the school grounds and keep the area as safe as we can. Please do not attempt to get in through the barriers as you will be turned away.

Payments in School

There will be times where you need to pay for school trips or lunch money, at Scarning we use an online payment system called School Money. On this site you are able to pay for dinners, school trips and clubs. More information on how to use this site can be found on our website.

IMPORTANT FORMS TO RETURN:

We have sent home the family update forms this week. These forms must be returned immediately to enable us to update your child's emergency details. If you have changed your details in the last few days via Pupil Asset these changes will not show on the form as they were printed before this. Please make sure these are signed and dated.

We will also be sending home trip consent forms. Please can these be signed and returned as well.

Photo Consent - You will already have informed us of your photo consent preferences, if you wish to amend these details please speak to the office or request an opt out form.

If you wish for your child to leave school by themselves (Yr5 & 6 only), please complete a form (even if this has previously been completed for the last academic year). In exceptional circumstances Mr King may authorise for a Yr4 child to leave by themselves. These are available to download from the school website or paper copies are available from outside the front office.

Safeguarding Children

Please help us in keeping your children safe by calling us if your child is not able to come to school so we can mark the register accordingly. If the office is closed you can leave a message anytime of the day or night on our answer machine stating your child's details including the reason they are absent from school or record the absence via the Pupil Asset website on the day of the absence only. If we do not receive notification of an absence we will firstly text and if we get no reply from that we will telephone you. It is also possible we may make a home visit to ensure everyone is ok if we do not hear from you. Any absence we cannot give a reason for will be recorded as unauthorised absence. The purpose of Scarning Primary School's safeguarding policy is to ensure every child who is a registered pupil at our school is safe and protected from harm. Mr N King is the Designated Safeguarding Lead. Mrs E Simpson, Mrs M King and Mr S Howell are the deputy designated leads. Mrs Hardwick is the Governors for Safeguarding and Child Protection.

Earrings

Children with pierced ears should only wear stud style earrings at school. All earrings must be removed by the child for PE activities. If your child is not able to remove their own earrings, please ensure that you remove them before school on a day they have PE. We can not supply medical tape for the amount of children who say they can not remove their earrings and it is very disrupting to PE lessons.

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Dear parents/carers

I am writing to inform you that the school will be taking part in a jointly run operation between Norfolk County Council, Norfolk Police and our school, which is called Operation Encompass. This has been set-up to help schools provide support to children who have been present at incidents of domestic violence. We know that children can be significantly physically or emotionally harmed when they are involved in, present or witness to domestic violence.

The school will receive a confidential phone call from the Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub before 9am on the morning after any domestic incident where a child at their school has been involved in, present or witness to domestic violence.

The school have designated Mr King, Mr Howell, Mrs Simpson and Mrs King as Key Adults. They have received designated safeguarding lead training from Norfolk County Council to allow them to use the information that has been shared in confidence to make sure that the right support is available for children and their families, who have been involved in or witnessed a domestic violence incident.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to our pupils and we believe this is going to be extremely beneficial for all those involved.
